YEAR THREE

Milestones: Preliminary exams and start writing dissertation, submission to journals and participation in conferences.



Milestones: Finish dissertation, conduct job search, application and interviews, oral defense of dissertation.

ENG --> 1. Take ENG 511 in their first semester if they don't have that class in their transcripts. If they are teaching ENG101, biweekly meetings with Casie
