RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

Research Assistant. Peanut Allergy and Proximity Risk Project (March 2016- May 2016). This project focused on how interested parties position peanut allergy in relation to risk, space, interaction, culture, and regulation at a site where the presence of peanuts has been debated: airlines. Coded submissions (~800) to the Federal Register in 2010 to comment on the banning of peanut products on airplanes. This project is funded through the H&SS SRA.

Participant Recruiter and Research Assistant. Healthy Eatonville research project (2013). This project focused on the diabetes and other chronic diseases in a community whose diabetes rate was nearly triple the national average, as well as had high rates of hypertension, high cholesterol, and smoking. Recruited participants, created focus group questionnaire, and analyzed data. This research and analysis led to the creation and opening of Healthy Eatonville Place: <http://healthycentralflorida.org/healthy-eatonville-place/>.

Participant Recruiter, Transcriber, and Interviewer. Infant Feeding research study (August 2012- December 2012). This project focused on the racial disparities in breastfeeding. Recruited participants of a very specific population (Black/ African American, first time mothers, with a child 6 months or younger) for a pilot study used to obtain a larger grant. I also transcribed all of the interviews (ranging from an hour to two hours) word for word and interviewed some of the participants.

Research Assistant. International Encyclopedia of Social and Behavioral Sciences, Second Edition (August 2011- January 2012). Reviewed materials and suggested possible contributors.

Field Surveyor. LEGOLAND Rollercoaster Project through the Institute of Social and Behavioral Sciences (April 2012). This project focused on family perceptions' of the safety rollercoaster rides and associated risks. Conducted face-to-face interviews with families throughout the park.
